Words from the General Curator — Nobuo Onishi

There are artists who are discovered, and artists who remain hidden. Some never see the light of day. Yet, no matter their circumstances, they continue to create. Perhaps it's precisely because they have the strength that comes with living with a disability — an enviable persistence we unconsciously lack.

"Art Brut" is just a label we've given; it doesn't matter to them.

When I talk to their parents, I often receive hints about how the works come to life. But parents also confess: "If dreams could come true, we'd just like to have a single conversation."

Knowing this depth reveals the life behind the works and deepens the silent dialogue with the artists.

It is the imagination of the audience that nurtures affection for the artists and their work. That same imagination can shape the future society.

There is an invisible power and creative force entrusted to art — and to our ability to imagine.
